Supporting your child in their PPE

With PPE1 next week, we know this can be a challenging time for students. Your support at home can make a huge difference to their confidence and performance. Here are a few practical ways you can help:

- Encourage a balanced routine
 Help your child plan a realistic revision timetable that includes breaks, healthy meals, and enough
 sleep. Short, focused bursts of revision are far more effective than late-night cramming.
- 2. Talk positively about the mocks Remind your child that mock exams are an opportunity to learn, not something to fear. They help identify strengths and gaps so teachers can give extra support where needed. It's a chance to build good habits for revision and get used to what sitting the GCSE will feel like.
- Offer encouragement and reassurance
 Celebrate effort, not perfection. A simple "You're doing well" can go a long way in reducing stress and boosting motivation.
- 4. Support with organisation Ensure they have basic equipment (pens, calculator, ruler, etc.) and know their exam timetable. Being prepared helps reduce anxiety on the day.





5. Promote healthy habits

Hydration, regular movement, and early bedtimes with good amounts of sleep all improve focus and memory. In the morning, please ensure they have a good healthy breakfast to fuel their mind.

6. Being Punctual

Ensure students are in school on time so that they are not rushing around and panicking and can ensure they are in the right mindset to approach the exam with the best attitude.






Open Academy Celebration of Christmas 2025-Save the Date
