A Story of Hard Work: Luke 5v1-11

Simon Peter and the other fishermen had been working all night, casting and pulling in their nets again and again, but they caught nothing. Even though they were tired and discouraged, they had completed their work faithfully. When Jesus asked Peter to try once more and lower the nets into deep water, Peter agreed despite his exhaustion. Through their willingness to keep working and not give up, their effort was rewarded with an overwhelming catch of fish.

This story reminds us that hard work, combined with perseverance and faith, can lead to great outcomes.

Peter was tired and discouraged, yet he chose to try again.


What helps you keep working hard when you feel exhausted or frustrated?

Story of Hard Work: Thomas Edison

Thomas Edison and the Light Bulb




Thomas Edison wanted to invent a light bulb that could last a long time and be safe to use in homes. The problem was that no one had figured out the right material for the filament—the part that glows. Edison didn't give up easily. He tested hundreds of materials. Many experiments failed, and people told him he was wasting his time. Instead of quitting, Edison kept working, learning from each mistake. He believed that every failure taught him something new. After many long days and nights of hard work, Edison finally found a filament that worked. His invention changed the world by bringing light into homes, schools, and streets.

Lesson: Hard work means staying patient, learning from mistakes, and continuing even when success takes a long time.
