Your future

- Unprecedented times.
- ► This is the first time that that you will have to select subjects at school.
- You will be staying in education or training until the age of 18. (This is called 'Raising the Participation Age')
- Choices made now may help your future career pathway.
- Your choices will not limit / stop you entering a particular career but they may help them get there.

Types of courses on offer

- Subjects that are on offer are full GCSE courses or their equivalents.
- Some courses are more vocational and develop skills for employment. These are GCSE equivalent courses - they can only do a limited number of these. There are BTECs OCR Nationals, vGCSEs and many more.
- Teachers will advise on suitability for various courses.

The English Baccalaureate

- ►The Government has introduced the EBacc to identify students following a broad academic range of subjects (English, Maths, Science, Humanities and a Language).
- It is expected that most students to follow the EBacc route however those who could one day go onto university will need it.
- ▶This has been voted for in 3 general elections.
- The EBacc has become more important for colleges, universities and employers e.g. several universities will only accept students with EBacc.
- ►The Education Minister expects all pupils to follow EBacc.

Core subjects in Year 10/11

- English
- English Literature
- Mathematics
- Science
- Physical Education
- PSHE, Careers and Citizenship (SKL) RE
- A Humanity geography or history.
- ► A Modern Foreign Language we do Spanish.

Advice

- Approximately 900 000 students will be choosing options this year.
- By making sure that everybody does the core subjects no career is closed to you.
- Nationally there is a great shortage of scientists, mathematicians, engineers, and linguists. They generally get paid well.

There are more courses available than can run. This is to give you actual choice!

- We have to offer Value for Money for the taxpayer.
- ▶ If 6 students pick GCSE Basket Weaving then we would not be able to offer it as a GCSE option at the normal time. We might be able to offer it after school.
- ▶ If 58 students pick GCSE Morris Dancing then we would have 2 classes. If 27 students pick it then we would have 1 class.

Will I get my choices?

You will end up with 4 extra subjects.

- There will be a humanity.
- There will probably be a language.
- There will be 2 other subjects.

- 93% of students ended up with their guided first choices in all categories.
- 7% of students got their first and second choice in one category.

How will effort have an impact?

- We have a class size limit of 30 in most classrooms.
- There must be an average of 26 in all classes because of the numbers of students.
- That leaves 4 students between the average class size and the biggest.
- If 5 students apply for those places in a particular course then a choice will be made using the following criteria:
 - Timeouts / GMs in that subject
 - Timeouts / GMs overall
 - Commendations
 - Homework quality and completion
 - Attendance

Getting the best combinations of pupils

- We will be changing some students sets so that they work with different people to see if that helps or hinders them.
- That way we know who could work with whom.
- If there is a combination of pupils that do not work well together they will not be allowed in the same class even if that means they can't have their first choices.

And finally...

▶ Be careful not to choose what your friends choose unless it is what you really want. Even if you pick the same subjects you may not be in the same classes. I will separate pupils who do not work well together

If you would like a particular course and it is not present on the preference form that will be because historically there was no demand. If you don't ask...

And finally (- a bit more...)

We will try and accommodate all requests but....

sometimes we are not able to do this due to large/small numbers choosing some subjects (it varies year by year)

and.... lack of suitability of some students to certain courses
