

Dear Parents

Spring Term return for face to face teaching is delayed so that we can set up (LFT). This will allow us to screen the whole Academy community for COVID-19 as we return. Students timetables will resume online on the 4th January then in the academy staggered as per the details below

Happy new year! In the light of recent announcements from the Department of Education, I apologise that we must alter our start of term arrangements. The situation is changing fast so we are having to respond quickly and, uncomfortable though this is, I am hopeful that the new year brings us much closer to the end of the pandemic. I will therefore try to be as brief and clear as possible and split the information in to clear sections.

Our current plan is described below. We will respond to all new guidance as we receive it although I will try to keep major change announcements to my Friday newsletters, however you will receive a personalised letter for each of your children with details of the mass COVID-19 test program, how you can register them and give informed consent for them to take part and crucially when they are expected to come in for their tests


The Key Headlines are...

- Teaching will start on the 4th January for ALL however, apart from minor exceptions, this
 will be virtually from home. Students please log in to teams for the first assembly of the
 year at 8.45
- Years 11 and 13 will return to the academy on Monday January 11th but we would like them to attend for their first 'Lateral Flow Test' (LFT) on the 7th (Year 13) and 8th (Year 11) January
- All other years will return to the academy on Monday January the 18th but we would like them to attend for their first 'Lateral Flow Test' (LFT) on the 12th and 15th January (Year 7,10,12) on the 14th January (Year 8,9) see table below
- Year 13 Students who have an exam on 6th Jan will be supported to prepare online by the PE staff and will come in for the exam as if it was a normal school day
- All other external vocational exams from wb 11th Jan will happen as planned students
 expecting vocational exams over the next two weeks, please see attached information for
 arrangements and support
- Students whose parents come under the critical worker category can be in from the 4th January at parent request, please email for a place as soon as possible to Mr Wilkinson at phillip.wilkinson@open-academy.org.uk

Teaching and Learning key information

- We would like all students to be up and logged in for form time at 8.40 on Monday 4th January. Teachers will be setting work and delivering learning through TEAMS according to students timetables
- Learning **in the academy** will start for years 11 and 13 on the Monday 11th January. We will expect all these students in from 8.30 on the 11th. All other year groups will Learn from home as per their timetable.
- Learning **in the academy** for the rest for the year groups will begin on Monday the 18th January. We will expect all students in from 8.30 on the 18th
- At times there may be issues with providing online learning. All Key Stage 3 students have access to their Knowledge Organisers to practice from if there are technological hiccups along the way.





 There are no HUB sessions for most students however some students might still be invited via TEAMs for some extra mentoring or extra support. If your child is involved a TEAMs invite will be issued and appear in their calendar which can be found in the left hand panel of TEAMs.


Week beginning the 4th January 2021 (Week A)

- All students will access remote learning through Microsoft Teams.
- Students follow their usual academy timetables and attend live support with their teacher during
 the timetabled lesson time (invite sent over Teams). Students should attend live lessons with
 microphone on and cameras off and use the chat facility.
- Teachers will share relevant resources and support via Microsoft Teams. Students will find this in either the files or Classnote for their class team.
- If students have problems logging into the system, they can use the Spring knowledge organiser that has been posted home. This contains all the relevant knowledge that students are learning with linked activities for every subject.
- All work will be checked for learning through homework set according to the homework timetable (see attached). Teachers will set and mark this homework in Microsoft Teams assignments.
- For all key stages there is also alternative learning available via our website such as Sam Learning, Seneca, Mathswatch etc.
- If students in KS4 or KS5 struggle to access online learning, they should use the revision materials and books they have been provided with by teachers to continue their work and reading. All pupil premium students have received revision guides for all their subjects in Y11.
- Please refer to our attached remote learning guide that explains our approach in more detail.
- Y10 and Y12 students were due to sit PPE's (Pre-Public Examinations) in classrooms from Monday 4th January. These will now be postponed until students are back in the Academy and they are now scheduled from Monday 18th January 2021.
- Y13 will be invited in for the first of their COVID-19 tests on Thursday 7th January in the afternoon
- Y11 will be invited in by form group at specific times throughout the day on Friday 8th January for their first COVID-19 test

Week beginning the 11th January 2021 (Week B):

- Arrangements for remote learning are the same as above for the full week for all students EXCEPT Years 11 and 13 who will be back in the Academy for face to face teaching and following their usual timetables.
- We will be completing (LFT) of Years 11 and 13 on Monday 11th January. Students will be accompanied by their teachers to the Sports Hall to complete this process. **All Students must have a reading book with them** for use whilst waiting for testing processes to be completed.
- Please note students in all other year groups will be invited in by form group for the first of their COVID-19 tests during this week where they will be expected to attend either a morning or afternoon session for the purposes of COVID testing only. They must return home as soon as their test is completed
- Y7,10,12 will be invited in by form group at specific times throughout the day for the first of their COVID-19 tests on the 12th and 15th January
- Y8,9 will be invited in by form group at specific times throughout the day for the first of their COVID-19 tests on the 14th January their second test will be as they return on Monday the 18th January





Week beginning the 18th January 2021 (Week A):

- Y8,9 to have their 2nd test on Monday 18th and will remain in for their full return
- All students will be back in the Academy for face to face teaching and following their usual timetables.
- We will be completing LF tests for Years 8 and 9 on Monday 18th January. Students will be
 accompanied by their teachers to the Sports Hall to complete this process. Students are advised
 to ensure they have a reading book with them for use whilst waiting for testing processes to be
 completed.
- Year 9 are due to sit Examination Assessments in classrooms from this week. These will still take
 place as according to our assessment calendar.

Initial 'Lateral Flow Test' (LFT) Testing information

- Please note it is vitally important that we remain vigilant. Please do not send your child in to the academy if they have been told to self-isolate, or if they are showing any symptoms of the virus.
- You will receive a letter during the first week of term regarding our COVID-19 testing process
- Included with the letter will be the detail of the governments mass LF Testing program.
- It will highlight the purpose and process for testing outlining how we will aim to test all members of our academy community twice as they return to full time learning.
- As indicated above, we would like to complete the first tests for students before they return to lessons and to compete their second test at the latest on the day they are due to return to the academy full time
- Both the initial mass LF Test and the test and trace LFT process will require your consent and I
 hope you will give this freely and willingly to help us keep the community safe.
- The registration and consent processes will also be detailed in the letter you will receive this week including how you will be able to provide informed consent online, and how you will be able to register your child for their test.

Initial 'Lateral Flow Test' (LFT) timetable* subject to change as we develop provision



Test and trace

Once everyone is tested, and everyone is back in the academy, we will need to continue to be vigilant, however, instead of requiring all close contacts of positive cases to self-isolate for 10 days, we will start the cyclical testing which should mean that close contacts will be able to continue in the academy as long as they undergo a test every morning when they arrive and remain negative

We will also be testing staff weekly from now on to ensure they remain virus free and to help keep them safe in the academy

Exam groups - first week

- There are public exams for vocational students mainly 6th form starting next week. At present they are going ahead. Here are some key dates for the first week.
- Monday 4th / Tuesday 5th January
 Sport BTEC level 3 revision session on TEAMS. Invites have been sent.
- Wednesday 6th January
 Sport BTEC public exam. You will be 2m apart at all times including with your
 classmates. Further details will be given from Mr Richardson and Mrs Pickering before your
 exam.
- Thursday 7th / Friday 8th January HSC revision sessions on TEAMs for year 12. Followed by the public exam on Friday. Special revision session on TEAMs for year 13 for HSC and business.
- Lessons the week after are in person as the lateral flow tests should have been completed. Teachers will inform their classes about the revision schedules.
- Further information will be shared by your teachers during lessons next week

Free School Meal


