



# Open Academy Update 18 September 2020 For parents and students – please do discuss the contents with your child!

Once again please accept my deep appreciation for your efforts in getting your children to the academy.

Attendance is again excellent this week and we have very few at home for any reason let alone COVID-19 isolation.

The other huge congratulations from me is on how well the students are turned out. Apart from a few boys who really need belts to keep their shirts tucked in, **uniform is exceptional in all years** with the odd issue down to a handful of situations which are actively being resolved. This is a great effort on your part and is most appreciated by us as it reduces the potential for conflict during these challenging times.

Please also congratulate your children on their catch-up efforts. Across the academy we have averaged over 140 students in hub sessions per evening - **almost everyone we have requested**. There are one or two who have tried to duck out, but it is so important they catch up; continued avoidance might mean we need to consider an alternative to support those students to catch up. If required therefore, I may consider the need to introduce Saturday morning catch up for those few who are unable to fit it in during the week.

I would like to make a couple of pleas to try to keep things working as smoothly and safely as possible.

**Hand sanitiser.** We have noticed a couple of people bringing in their own. As we don't know what is in these or whether they meet our risk assessment criteria of at least 70% alcohol and hypo allergenic, we would rather they used the sanitiser provided. If you would prefer that they did not use this, then we are asking them to use the soap and water provided in the toilets and wash thoroughly for 20 seconds, so please do discuss this with your child.

**Arrival.** As the weather takes a turn for the worse, it is difficult to maintain the bubbles at the start of the day indoors, so we would encourage your child not to arrive too early. We need year 7s to arrive by 8.25am as they set off earliest from the atrium, and all other students need to be in their areas by 8.30am, however we would discourage them from arriving more than 10 mins before those times as they may be waiting outside in difficult weather conditions. We do have plans if the weather is atrocious, but they involve compromises that we would rather delay as long as possible.

Homework & Marking. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, staff cannot mark your child's books as usual. We are therefore asking that teachers set homework that reflects what your child has done in class via TEAMS to be completed online. Staff can then mark the work virtually. It is therefore vital that all students complete the work set, on time online. Loaned equipment has not been collected in to facilitate this and as far as we are aware, most students are able to access TEAMS from home on at least one device. It does mean however, that completion of homework is not optional. The homework timetable is now out, and it defines which weeks and subjects should have homework completed. Please do all you can to encourage your child to digitally hand it in on time - if they don't, they will miss out on crucial teacher feedback. If they have difficulties accessing TEAMS, they need to discuss it with their assistant head of year as soon as possible. Please note that the Year 7 homework start will be delayed by two weeks until we are sure they are all fully trained in the use of TEAMS.

We are most keen to ensure that we continue to develop our use of TEAMS as we know that if further proposed local lockdowns occur, we will be expected to continue to deliver education as we did before the summer break. Using TEAMS to solve the marking issue and to deliver homework is the best way we can think of to ensure we are able to switch quickly to online or 'blended' learning if as and when we need to.

**Finally, a note about our Open Evenings.** We would normally be looking forward to welcoming parents of Year 6 children in to look around and see what we are about. For obvious reasons that would be ill advised this year, but have no fear, we will be running a virtual Open Evening on Wednesday, 7 October for those interested in gaining a place in Year 7. Our 6th Form event is due the following week on Thursday, 15 October. More details will follow and be sent on to the primary schools shortly.

Please do make sure you catch up with your child's year team notices below and the general information which you might find of help. Once again, I am attaching the COVID-19 safety information sheet that we sent out last week for your convenience. It does have a handy guide to what to do if your child is ill section.

<u>Year 13 only:</u> Further to some considerations, and taking into account the student voices, we have come to the decision to allow students to work from home during some of their private study sessions. We can only allow those sixth formers with a proven track record of working really effectively in private study time to apply. That means Year 13s who have always kept on track. There are three different slots in which we can authorise students to work from home:

AM (the student has no subject lessons P1-P3)
PM (the student has no subject lessons P4 & P5)
Full day (the student has no subject lessons all day)

Please note that if students have lessons at any point in the morning (P1-P3) they will have to attend tutor time registration as normal at 8:40am. If they have any lessons in the afternoon (P4 or P5), you will have to be in the Academy by 1:00pm for your registration. This is vitally important for both safeguarding and in case of a fire drill.





If you would like to be considered to go home during private study periods, please can you email me with your days for week A and week B.

I have to apply to SLT for each case. They will review and decide each case based upon my recommendation.

Any student that has fallen behind in any of their subjects will automatically be placed in the hub that week, and as such will not be permitted to leave the Academy during their private studies at all. As such, the rules around who can stay at home during private study sessions may, and most likely will, change on a weekly basis. We trust that students will continue to work during their private studies if they have been permitted to do so from home. Our aim has always been to help students to achieve and be the very best that they can be at OA6.

And finally, the upcoming **UK University & Apprenticeship Search Virtual Fair** is taking place on Wednesday, 14 October from 12:00-18:00. The event is free, it will feature over 80 universities, colleges and apprenticeship providers, and it's open to students in Years 13, 12 and 11.

I know everyone is very busy settling into a new term and studying hard. I just wanted to pass on some thoughts to help with studying:

- Plan ahead! Work out when that deadline is and work backwards so that you have plenty of time.
- Be prepared know what you need for each school day and organise this in advance.
- Try and minimise distractions think about where you study and potential distractions from texts/social media alerts etc.
- Split up tasks so that you know exactly what you are doing in the time you have don't try and write an essay in one go if you know splitting the task would work better for you.
- Plan in regular breaks it will keep you motivated and alert. One method is to work for 25 minutes without stopping, have a 5 minute break and repeat a couple of times before taking a longer break.
- Keep motivated work out your goal and remember the positives.
- Ask for help when you need it people will be happy to help you.

# 13. Aspens School Meals Update & Menu

# Ready to serve

As promised in our letter at the end of term, we want to take this opportunity to share further information with you about your school meal service.

Our goal continues to make eating at school a pleasurable experience and offer healthy and nutritious meals in line with Government guidelines. Over the last few weeks, we have introduced changes in line with the latest guidance by introducing new procedures and training in areas such as social distancing, food safety and enhanced cleaning regimes. This means that we can continue to produce and serve food safety for your children.

Here's a summary of what we have been doing, to give you reassurance as your children return to school:

# Changes your children will notice

- We have reviewed how the children come into the dining room to make sure we allow for social distancing and minimise queue times.
- Changes have been made to service areas to avoid queuing, lingering and bottlenecks.
- Signs in the dining room and on plasma screens will give children a few helpful reminders such as only touching the food they are eating and to avoid sharing food or drinks with others.
- To limit what each pupil touches, we will not have any self-service salad bar options. These will be managed by our team eliminating the use of shared utensils.





 We will still offer a range of sandwiches, boxed salads and baguettes, cakes and fruit but they will be wrapped. We do understand this will temporarily increase packaging but we will endeavour to keep this to a minimum level.

# Changes in the kitchen and with our team

- We will hold daily briefing sessions to prepare for the day ahead.
- Flexible working hours and rearranging workstations will make sure that social distance measures are upheld.
- Kitchen ventilation will be increased by opening windows and doors.
- We are limiting the number of deliveries to site and accepting these deliveries on a "no contact" basis.
- Visitors will not be allowed in the kitchen.
- We have new, enhanced recording procedures including food hygiene and safety. Each meal service is then certified as being compliant by our Head of Health & Safety.
- Our teams are carrying out specific return to work and COVID-19 training and will be certified "fit to work".
- We are continuously updating guidance underpinned by bite size training modules for our cooks, chefs and catering assistants.
