



Open Academy Update 16 July 2021 For parents and students – please do discuss the contents with your child.

Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome to my last newsletter of the academic year – although please note that I will send out a letter regarding the new academic year, starting arrangements and various reminders on the last day next week. Remember we close at 12.30pm on Wednesday, 21 July, our last day of term, so the students will be heading home early as is customary on the final day of the summer term.

What a year! Even today we have had to send Year 9 home for self-isolation due to a positive lateral flow test and we await the PCR test result in case we can invite the Year 9s back on Monday – I am not holding my breath, however, as usually they confirm the lateral flow. Mr Pimlott, our chaplain, is always here if support is required for anyone in our community, as I know it has been tough for many.

Fortunately, we have managed to get a very full term in since Easter and I just wanted to say a huge thank you to the Year 11 and Year 13 students who have done an amazing job as interns helping and supporting the younger students. There have been so many examples of excellence, I will just say that we must work out how to do this next year and indeed throughout the year, as it has proved to be a huge success for both interns and younger students. I think what has heartened most staff is the confidence that the interns have gained, growing so much in the space of a few short weeks. I am sure as they re-join us for 6th Form in September, or indeed head off to university, they will be so much better prepared than they may have been.

Catch up curriculum wise, there is a fantastic mural of the Norwich Skyline being finalised in the Science corridor now – great work by interns and students alike, I picked half a dozen winners for the Open Games logo t-shirt competition from so many excellent entries and the students have been preparing their work for the literary festival next week, so loads of great activities have been underway and many will come to their finale next week. Monday will see the first day of sports day with more traditional sports and track events, then in the early evening the photography students will be exhibiting their work in the St Francis Church Hall just around the corner – with drinks and nibbles available. I hope that it will be a pleasant early evening event start time for parents at 4pm. Tuesday will see the second sports day/festival and games day with over 25 activities for the students to enjoy – almost like a fair with performances, games and competitions it promises to be an epic day – topped off with the Year 11 Prom. Arrivals from 6.30 at Sprowston Manor will be the first we have managed for two years now, so it will be wonderful to say cheerio to the Year 11s properly.

We will round off Wednesday morning with our literary festival, which promises to be a great celebration of the students' hard work so all in all a really fun packed few days left.

COVID Safety and testing over the summer...

There is not a requirement to test over the summer unless your child is in a school. As we will not be open (apart from summer school for Year 6 into 7) that means we will not be providing test kits and will be mass testing all children as they return in September. Having said that, COVID rates in Norfolk are rising and **local health services are asking that you do continue testing**. This is very much a matter for your own discretion so I have attached the letter from Norfolk County Council's Director of Health, which encourages you to keep testing and advises where kits may be obtained from. I will give details of our proposed testing process which will be staggered over the training days and first few days of term when I write on Wednesday and when I have the most up to date picture possible.

We wanted to let you know about an interesting opportunity we've heard about to participate in a research project which the Network for East Anglian Collaborative Outreach (<u>NEACO</u>) are running during July and August. To help understand and improve the work we all do to help young people and their parents/guardians in Norfolk, the research will look at the support needs of parents/guardians who have children aged 14 to 18 who find it difficult to be involved in their young person's education and plans for the future.

The research includes an online questionnaire which will take around 20 minutes of your time to complete, for which you will be offered a £5 shopping voucher. You can also take part in a 30-minute telephone or video call and receive a further £25 shopping voucher as a thank you for your time.




10. Logo Competition



I quote from the Bible in saying this:




