2. Year 8

Please remind your child that phones are not allowed to be used in school. The reasoning behind this is based on educational research around avoiding distractions and higher quality learning. In addition to this, recently we have dealt with a number of students using their phones to bully others. This has included taking pictures/videos without permission, possibly with the intention of posting these on social media platforms to humiliate. Phones need to be switched off and in their bags, not on silent and in their pockets!

I would also ask that you check their phones regularly as we have dealt with issues of bullying in group chats. A number of students in a WhatsApp group have been encouraging other students to fight and take sides against individuals. In Year 8 they are still very young to have such access and some are making serious errors in judgement in posting online abuse. This is from a variety of students across the year group and all students are capable of making a mistake.

Please talk to your child about online safety, including who to talk to if they are worried by either messages or content they have seen, or indeed something they have posted. Please talk to them about what is appropriate to post. A general rule of thumb is 'how would a family member feel if they read your post?'




