On the evening, feedback was very positive, with many saying it was a useful event. I would like to thank Mr Fisher who organised the event, Miss Wenlock and Mr Ward who delivered sessions, and all the staff who took the time to prepare a display of revision material. I will also thank the 3 students who attended my wellbeing session, although I would concede the other sessions were probably more pressing at this time!

As the year wears on, however we will be putting on wellbeing sessions within school to help Year 11 get through. 


