31 March 2023 Students hand in first draft of Options Form (they can change their mind still)

May 2023 Organise curriculum and choose which courses can run

May / June 2023 Hire teachers if required

7 June 2023 Options offer letters returned to students confirming their courses for Year 10.

African Music Course Support




