

# **Open Academy Update 2 December 2022**

Dear Parents, Carers and Students

Welcome to this week's newsletter.

This week I would like to focus on our Christmas as it has seen the start of Advent.

Advent is a Christian season of preparation for the Nativity of Christ at Christmas which then marks the start of the Christian year. As we are a Christian ethos school, this is a significant time for us, as we use the example of Jesus to shape our approach to supporting our students through their education.

We are a rare thing, being one of only around a dozen or so Christian ethos schools in the country. We benefit greatly from being part of the Church of England's education work as we are part of the Diocese of Norwich Education and Academies Trust (DNEAT) who support and encourage us in our work to deliver an inclusive education.

In practice, being a Christian ethos school means that our community benefits from Mark, our chaplain, who is there for any member of our community – staff, students or parents at times of need. He regularly, through assemblies, shares the good news of the bible and helps students to understand the world and when required, understand their spirituality. It also means that everything we do reflects and builds our strong Christian values, which we rehearse daily to give students the ability to make good choices for themselves and our community.

Most significantly, we strive to see every member of our community as the blessing that they are. Even though sometimes the blessing we receive may not be obvious we may receive the blessing of patience in difficult circumstances. I might even reflect I received the blessing of humility thanks to our Ofsted visit, but, whatever the situation and whatever we try to do with it, we aim to use these ideas to do the right thing. Yes, we are human and make mistakes, but we continue in the knowledge that we will find forgiveness!

The season gives us the opportunity to explore faith with the students a little more obviously than normal and I am delighted to say that Reverend Janet, at our local church, St Francis, has agreed to host Year 7 for a traditional service of lessons and carols at St Francis on the morning of Thursday, 15 December. We will make the short walk over to the church and then enjoy singing carols and hearing the readings that make up the Christmas story with an opportunity to reflect and pray in the tradition Christian way. I hope your child will enjoy this opportunity, as previous experience tells me that nothing gets people in the Christmas spirit like singing carols together.

From that point of view, we hope to welcome everyone into the academy for an evening of carols and Christmas encouragement on Wednesday, 14 December at 6.30pm. This annual well-loved and attended event will see parents, staff and pupils come together to enjoy a Christmassy evening of company and carols. Please do come along if you are free – it will be great to see you at this lovely event.

Finally, I need to remind you that as always, the academy closes to students at 12.30 on the last day of term – Friday, 16 December. Students will have break as normal and those who have free school meals will be able to collect a packed lunch at break time. We will register the children before dismissing them at 12.30. I will send a letter next week to inform you all as a reminder.

So let the advent season begin. I will be getting on with decorating the house for Christmas this weekend, and as I do, I will be reflecting on the amazing generosity and spirit of the community I am so fortunate to be part of here at Open. In the end, Team Open Mo raised £600 for men's health charities – doubling our target – all of which will go to support men's health charities and awareness raising for prostate cancer, testicular cancer and male mental health. However, it never stops, needs are continuing in these challenging times, so please do pay particular attention to the request from Miss Trail later in this newsletter regarding sponsorship for our sports team's




kit. If you can help either personally or from your business point of view, we will be delighted to hear from you.
