



Open Academy Update 9 December 2022

Dear Parents, Carers and Students

Welcome to this week's newsletter. I will start by apologising that we struggled to get it published last week. We thought it had been sent out, but the size of the attachments meant it got stuck in the outbox. Once we knew it was missing on Monday morning (thank you all those who told us) we did eventually get a message out to say where it could be viewed. We then subsequently managed to get it sent on Tuesday, so hopefully many of you will have already found the bits relevant to you online. However, as you may not have seen it as it came out via our website and then late I am going to re-publish my section on what is happening in the run up to Christmas below to ensure you are aware of various Christmas activities and notices. I would also add that as well as finishing early on the last day of term as usual, I have had a request for the last day to be a non-uniform day to raise fund for the Year 11 prom.

In addition to the Carol concert at 6.30pm on Wednesday, 14 December (open to all), the St Francis Lessons and Carols on Thursday, 15 December morning for Year 7 and the early close reminder for Friday 16 December - students leave at 12.30, I am also now flagging that the last day 16 December is a non-uniform day - nominal fee if you can spare it is £1 for the prom committee. There will also be a bake sale at break time on the last day with festive goodies available, once again in aid of the prom.

Please note the key information below if you missed it:

From that point of view, we hope to welcome everyone into the academy for an evening of carols and Christmas encouragement on Wednesday, 14 December at 6.30pm. This annual well-loved and attended event will see parents, staff and pupils come together to enjoy a Christmassy evening of company and carols – please do come along if you are free – it will be great to see you at this lovely event.

The season gives us the opportunity to explore faith with the students a little more obviously than normal and I am delighted to say that Reverend Janet, at our local church, St Francis, has agreed to host our Year 7 for a traditional service of lessons and carols at St Francis on the morning of Thursday, 15 December. We will make the short walk over to the church and then enjoy singing carols and hearing the readings that make up the Christmas story with an opportunity to reflect and pray in the tradition Christian way. I hope your child will enjoy this opportunity, as previous experience tells me that nothing gets people in the Christmas spirit like singing carols together.

I also need to remind you that as always, the academy closes to students at 12.30 on the last day of term on Friday, 16 December. Students will have break as normal and those who have free school meals will be able to collect a packed lunch at break time. We will register the children before dismissing them at 12.30. A reminder will be sent next week to inform you all. Please note, this last day will be a non uniform day toosee above.

Finally, it is worth repeating just in case: we are hoping to get some sponsorship to fund the purchase of new sports uniforms and kit for, in the first instance our netball teams. Yesterday was an emotional day for our Year 11 students as they received their PPE exam results from their recent round of assessments. 
