



Open Academy Update 13 January 2023

Dear Parents, Carers and Students

Welcome to our newsletter this week.

The first thing I would like to mention is the start of our parent engagement program. **Next Tuesday**, **17 January**, we are kicking off the programme with a session on our most recent Ofsted report. The session will start at 5pm and end at 6pm. After a presentation and talk from me, I will be available with governors and other senior staff to answer questions both as a group and individually. Please do take the opportunity to come in and get to know us a bit better, have your say and share your thoughts, as well as finding out what we have done and what we are doing regarding our Ofsted report. **Refreshments will be available to the tune of teas, coffees and biscuits and everyone is welcome to come along**. If you want to bring your children you can, but the focus of these sessions is for parents.

I do have a huge thank you to parents this week given that we have had such brilliant support in ensuring that all students are in full correct uniform. By yesterday we were literally down to one or two students who were not quite there, but we are confident that **from Monday every student at the academy will be in full correct uniform.** This makes for a much more ordered academy, without the grandstanding of a few proudly displaying defiance, or anyone feeling left out or different because of their clothing. As always if you are having any difficulties in acquiring uniform for any reason, please do contact your child's assistant head of year who will be happy to help.

We have successfully challenged uniform by creating a reflection room in the football block. Where students are not in correct uniform they have been required to work in there throughout the day to minimise disruption to the smooth running of the academy. With your help and support, this has proved most successful and as uniform is now largely correct, we will be turning our attention to in-school truancy next week. During the week we will be warning students found outside their lessons or support that they are truanting internally and they will receive the usual Friday detention. However, we will also be contacting parents and carers to ensure that there are no problems we are unaware of and any issues are fully understood, so that we can ensure they are appropriately supported if they are not already, then from the following Monday, we propose a similar focus as we have started on uniform so...

From Monday, 23 January students picked up outside lessons without permission, will be escorted to truancy reflection where they will remain working with senior staff for the rest of the day and making up time missed after school. Failure to follow instructions will result in suspension for the rest of the day in the first instance. Further failures will be escalated up through our behaviour process with longer suspension and may result in students being put on Individual Behaviour Plans or Personal Support Plans. Once again, we would hope to get your full support for this measure, as it is an important issue to resolve for those involved. Students who are struggling have nominated support plans through our green card system, so as long as they access their agreed support they will not be affected. If you have any concerns, I encourage you to talk to the assistant head of year for your child to ensure we have their support package right.

The atmosphere in the academy is, post pandemic, once again returning to being a happy and positive place for all. We are determined to ensure we support all to enjoy their time in the academy and to get the best out of their education. We know at times some students are struggling and we are set up ready to help and support, but they must work with us and use the support offered, so that we can ensure that all students are appropriately supervised and safeguarded at all times.

I will therefore once again **thank you for your continued support** in ensuring that we continue to create an environment a positive and pleasant environment to work and learn


8. Attendance
