Only one more week to go and I cannot tell you how proud I am of how the Year 9s are doing in every respect. Attendance, conduct around the building and performance in their lessons are all as they should



be and we will be recognising and celebrating this with our 5th awards assembly on Monday morning. Please look out for a certificate with your young person as we have lots of nominations from teachers.

We have run several trips this year in Year 9 designed to raise both literacy levels and awareness of higher education. On Wednesday, Mr Hawkins and Miss Moy took a group of Year 9s to Cambridge university as part of the UEA's "Raise your words" programme. All students behaved brilliantly and gained a valuable insight into higher education at one of the most elite universities in the world. They all took part in the activities based around oracy and represented the school superbly.

Although the vast majority are taking advantage of all the learning available in lessons there are a small number who continue to truant lessons sometimes which means they are struggling to access work next time they are there. As a result, we have made a change to our policy regarding truancy. The letter below has been sent out by email:

Dear parent/guardian

We want to make you aware of an important change in policy regarding truancy in the year group. As we approach the start of GCSEs for our students it is crucial that they are in all lessons during the day. All the evidence shows that students that are regularly missing lessons are making significantly less progress than their peers and we want every year 9 to have the best chance of succeeding in their GCSEs.

Another factor is that most problems during the day arise when a student is not in their lesson as they may not be in a supervised space.

As a result we have decided, from Monday, 19 May, any student who receives a truancy mark will automatically receive an after-school detention on that same day. If there are legitimate reasons why that student has not attended a particular lesson then the year team will remove the truancy. Students with green cards will still be able to use these to access their support.

It is important to note that doing the detention on the same day (in order to catch up on work missed) will mean that the truancy detentions on a Friday will not take place for Year 9.

If the student fails to attend their truancy detention this will mean the time will be extended to 60 mins the following day.

As a year group in general they are doing fantastically well and following our expectations, but we hope you can understand and support our reasons for taking this action before the start of year 10.


