1. New Principal's Message

I am writing to introduce myself as the new Principal of The Open Academy. I am absolutely delighted to be joining the school and becoming part of your community.

For the past four years, I have been the Headteacher at Pakefield High School in Suffolk. During that time, I have had the privilege of working with a dedicated team of staff and wonderful students, and together we moved the school from a judgment of Requires Improvement to Good. That journey was built on a shared belief in high expectations, strong relationships, and a clear focus on what matters most – excellent teaching and learning for every child.

I am now incredibly excited to bring that same passion and commitment to The Open Academy. I have already started working with the staff here, and we are beginning to put plans in place for some changes that will be introduced from September. These are all designed to strengthen the culture of the school, improve outcomes for students, and ensure that Open becomes a place where every young person feels proud to belong.

Over the coming weeks and months, I look forward to meeting as many of you as possible. I know how important a strong partnership between home and school is, and I am committed to working closely with parents and carers as we move forward together.

One important change we will be making in September is to the structure of the school day. In order to meet the Department for Education's expectation that all schools provide a minimum of 32.5 hours each week, we will be slightly extending the start of the day. From September, the school day will begin at 8.30am, with all students taking part in a structured morning line-up before going into the form time programme. The end of the school day will remain at 3.00pm. We believe this change will support a calm and purposeful start to the day, while also ensuring we meet the national requirement. Punctuality is key to this purposeful start, and I thank you in advance for ensuring your child is in school and ready to learn by 8.30am each day. For your reference, all timings of the day are shown below.

I will be in touch again soon with other updates as we prepare for the next school year. I am genuinely excited about what we can achieve together in the years ahead.
