Message from the Principal

Thanks for your feedback!

It was great to receive some parent feedback this week – both from this newsletter – thank you to those who emailed in and to the brave sole who came in for the senior leader drop in session on Monday.

I will be working through comments and observations received with my team, and over time, I know your input will help us in our improvement drive.

For instance I know we still have a few teething problems with the app but almost everyone should have access now. As regards the app, I also know that in some instances you are getting details on where the positive points praise and awards are coming from, however not every time. We know there is an element of technical fix required from the app developer which should be coming late October. Thanks to some feedback we also have to check that all other aspects of the system are fully operational, which we hope to have completed in the next week or so.

I am delighted to report that homework expectations have been significantly raised – Over 3000 homeworks have been set since the start of term and over 2500 have been completed with over 80% hand in rate, so thank you for supporting your child in their work. Invitations to study support for those falling behind will be starting to appear shortly. If your child receives one, please do ensure that they attend.

As the year groups' news is beginning to appear, I said I would aim to keep my articles brief, so I will leave it at that this week, save to say if you have family or friends considering Open Academy for their year 6 child, the Open Evening starts at 6.30pm on Wednesday, 2 October – we would be delighted to welcome them.
