Uniform

It is very clear on all possible issues like skirt length, trouser type etc., so we are keen to ensure that we get it right for the new term ahead and will be insisting on correct uniform as we go in to the new academic year.

I am delighted that the vast majority are now getting the uniform **right so I would like to thank you for your efforts in supporting the academy on this.** Where there are still issues, staff have been instructed to call and discuss the situation with individual parents.

Message from the Principal

Continuing with my articles to highlight how things are changing and improving here at the Academy, as promised, this week I would like to share a little around how we are developing a continuous professional development CPD programme for staff.

The Academy has used the Teacher Effectiveness Enhancement Programme (TEEP) for a number of years to support staff to continually develop their skills and it is a great program using triads of teachers to trial new methods, observe and support each other.

Using the same methods, we wanted to focus on areas that our staff team felt are important in our academy so, in a training session, we identified what we called Great Open Teaching – all the aspects of what we do that promote good lessons. All our suggestions fit well in to the following categories:

- Relationships
- Creative / growth mind-set
- Challenge
- Communication
- Progress
- Questioning
- Literacy

So we then asked staff to self-assess then pick a couple of areas they wanted to improve on and used the TEEP methods to trial out new strategies and approaches in those areas, with support of colleagues and their faculty.

As we completed our new 'Faculty Reviews' (more on those next week) we also identified whether staff might need to focus on any particular area next and we recorded who showed particular strengths in any of those areas, this way we are able to connect those with one set of skills with those who wish to work on that particular area.

We have started the programme this year alongside faculty review so we have some initial understanding of how useful it is. For instance as well as supporting individual teachers, overall it has led to our renewed focus on homework across the board as an Academy. We are therefore now looking forward to having a full year from September to really test out how it brings on our lessons.
