I will be brief this week as I have been out training for a couple of days and am not fully back in the swing of things. Support through our Learning Hub

I am particularly pleased to note how we are starting to support students with the Learning Hub, which was considered an excellent step forward by my fellow principals/headteachers, not to mention the strengths of our new assessment approach and the new knowledge organisers.

I am confident that in all year groups we are now getting regular and clear information on how well the students are progressing compared to their starting points and where assessment information says they might be falling behind, they are invited to put some time in at the learning hub at the end of the day. Here they can revise and catch up on ideas and information they have missed or not understood first time around, or work with teachers to get prepared for lessons they are finding tricky.

Where students appear to be struggling with getting their homework completed, the Learning Hub is there for them to catch up on missed work or use the Hub as a quiet space to get on top before deadlines. Invites should be going out thick and fast now where students are missing deadlines and I genuinely appreciate the support we are getting from you to ensure the students are turning up.

Support through our Knowledge Organisers

As we have now published the knowledge organisers for this term for the whole of Key Stage 3, students in Years 7, 8 and 9 can use these booklets to work independently at home or with support at the learning hub, to catch up on work they may have missed, or prepare for work they have to complete.

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Please do have a look through the knowledge organisers – under the parent tab on the website – specifically at this address: <u>Knowledge Organisers</u> as staff have put significant effort in planning ahead for the spring term and getting them ready to share with you and the students.

As usual I will be delighted to hear what you think about these various developments.

Although overall results are important, our priority in the academy is that students focus more on the areas of learning that need improvement and work with teachers in lessons to close gaps in their understanding and skills. Careers Information

Motivation

At this point in the school year, your child may be considering their next steps after sixth form, studying and revising for exams, planning work experience or beginning to consider which GCSE subjects to take. It's a busy time of year, combined with winter weather of shorter, colder days. Your child may find motivation slipping as they consider what they need to do. Everyone is different, but one or more of these ideas might help:

What are you working towards? Write or draw this, and stick it somewhere you can see it, to remind yourself of what you want.

- Visualise success. Imagine yourself revising or completing that essay. It's a technique used widely by athletes to help achieve success.
- Break your tasks down. Make a revision timetable or plan out your week, including when to write that CV for work experience or complete your homework. Breaking down your tasks should make them seem much less difficult and time consuming.
- Plan in time for your favourite activities. Even if you are revising for exams, you need to make sure you have regular breaks and free time balanced with study.

If you have a child in Year 11 and you are wondering how to support them with how to revise, helping them to study effectively, make a revision timetable or any other questions, it would be great to see you at our 'Advice and Slice' evening on Friday, 24 January (4.30-6pm). I am also attending Parents' Evening for Year 11 on Tuesday, 21 January (4-7pm), and would be delighted to chat to you then about revision, study or next steps after GCSEs.
